We also use Si Swun Mathematics and FOSS frameworks to build a strong math and science foundation in all students.

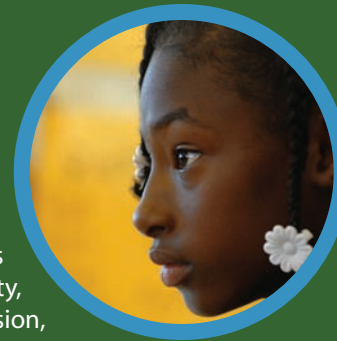
Innovative Campus

Our state-of-the-art campus integrates striking architecture, with many natural green areas and art studios. The site includes a dedicated Science Lab, Dance Studio, Music classroom, Family Resource Center, large recreation field, garden, and outdoor science area. Through a collaboration with the City of Oakland, a public library is under construction on the 81st Avenue corner of the campus.



Character and Leadership

At ACORN Woodland Elementary, academic rigor is complimented by a focus on the whole child. Our 9 core values - scholarship, integrity, perseverance, compassion, dignity, communication, leadership, reflection and inquiry - guide our character and leadership education. Additional leadership opportunities include Sports 4 Kids Jr. Coach, Student Leadership Team and Buddy Reading.



University Partnership

Every ACORN Woodland classroom partners with a university to increase college awareness. Our goal is that every young scholar leaves with the skills and determination to pursue a university education.



Performing and Visual Arts

Students access the arts during and after school through our partnerships with outstanding Bay Area teaching artists. Visual and performing arts, including fine arts, percussion, chorus, hip hop dance, and Baile Foklorico, are some of our core offerings.



Extended Learning Program

Students extend the learning of the school day with a multifaceted extended learning program featuring visual arts, chorus, dance, percussion, Science Explorers Club, Sports 4 Kids, TechGYRLS, Journalism, mentorship, field trips, and performances. Extended Reading, Academic Support and Homework Club take place daily.



Family Partnership

Families are integral to ACORN Woodland Elementary. We emphasize families as partners in learning through Home Visits and Student Work Exhibitions. Families take leadership through Governance Board, Family Academic Board, PTA, and Advisory Boards. Families contributes 4 hours of volunteer service monthly.
